Advocacy / Reach 338, Sylvie d'Alcantara, Administrator

The advocacy committee, composed of Jacques Lambert, Guy Bouchard, Pierre Desmarais and Sylvie d'Alcantara, works to improve the security and quality of life of seniors. Its priorities include fair pensions, access to quality health care, adequate housing and the protection of retirement benefits for public servants, military personnel and veterans.

In the current political context, 44 emails were sent to MPs on 19 November to organize meetings. Three priorities are addressed:

maintaining sustainable pension plans, strengthening home and long-term care, and ensuring equitable access to prescription drugs.

Finally, Canada Life <u>Bulletin 49</u> informs that since 1 November, management of the dental plan has been assumed by this company. Members must print their new card for appointments with their dentist or denturologist.

If you have not received your confirmation notice, please contact Canada-Life.


